## **COCKING PARISH COUNCIL**

#### MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE COUNCIL

#### 6 JUNE 2016 AT 6.30PM

#### AT THE VILLAGE HALL, BELL LANE, COCKING

#### 1. Apologies

Apologies for absence were received from Cllrs Burgess and O'Neill. The Chairman welcomed Miss Russell to her first meeting.

#### 2. Declarations of Interest

Members and officers were invited to make any declarations of pecuniary and/or non-pecuniary interests that they may have in relation to items on the agenda and were reminded to make any declarations at any stage during the meeting if it then became apparent that this may be required when a particular item or issue was to be considered.

Cllrs Keefe and Miss Russell declared an interest as members of the Village Hall Committee.

The Clerk declared an interest as an employee of the Council in relation to Minute 15.

#### 3. Minutes

The minutes of the meeting of the 10 May 2016, previously circulated were agreed as a correct record and signed by the Chairman.

#### 4. Matters Arising from the Minutes

13q. The Chairman had taken up the points raised in Mrs Buchannan's letter as reported at the last meeting and responded accordingly; he hoped to see some action on hedges etc shortly which should improve the appearance of the village

#### 5. Questions from Visitors

Mr Peter Stent of Pittsam Farm, was concerned at a recent report in the local newspaper, of a suggestion that good quality farmland which he tenanted from the Cowdray Estate, within Cocking parish boundary but abutting the southern boundary of Midhurst parish, could be developed for housing as part of the Midhurst Neighbourhood Plan. Parish Councillors shared Mr Stent's concern and the Clerk was asked to contact the Clerk at Midhurst for a report on the origin and status of this alarming suggestion, also commenting that they considered it somewhat discourteous to learn of such a suggestion in the local newspaper.

## 6. WSCC Report

Cty Cllr Brown reported that WSCC had allocated £2.5 million in each of the next 2 years to improve footways (i.e. by the road) therefore it was an opportune time to report areas requiring attention. (Footpath between the bus shelter on the southbound A286 opposite The Croft to Tollhouse Cottage where the bank is creeping out across the footpath making it too narrow for residents to walk safely. The daffodil bank at this location also required strimming to encourage the bulb display next year.)

He reported on an issue in Lynchmere where after a long campaign, the Lollipop man had been given a camera to wear on his chest, so as to record cars approaching him too fast. He felt that volunteers undertaking various speedwatch duties should be able to take photographs that were admissible in convictions etc. He would chase WSCC on the state of the barrier at Bumblekite – either remove or repair.

## 7. CDC Report

District Cllr Mrs Neville reported that the Hyde Group had changed their grounds maintenance provider and work had started on Mr Simon Marks' property. Children were climbing over a fence to the rear of The Croft onto farmland, which was of concern to Cllr Richard Marks as a local farmer, who feared an accident. She reported also on the need for CDC to improve its (and WSCC's) recycling rates, in order to avoid financial penalties. New markets were to be trialled in the centre of Chichester. Squash Courts at the Grange Centre were to be retained but those at Chichester would be lost.

#### 8. Planning Applications

Comments on applications as set out in Appendix A (attached) were RESOLVED.

Members commented on the poor state of 210 Cocking, a Listed Building. The Clerk would contact the owners, to ascertain their plans for improvement.

#### 9. Parish Matters

## a. Playground

Some minor repairs had been undertaken in advance of the forthcoming annual inspection.

#### b. Allotments

Cllr Marks confirmed that he would roll etc the former allotment site. Negotiations on the lease renewal were continuing.

## c. Newsletter

Nothing new to report.

#### d. Events

The *Drone Festival* had been cancelled. Plans for Queen's Birthday Tea Party were progressing well.

#### e. Village Hall

The Clerk had asked the freeholder for their view on extending the hall. The VHC had paid their annual insurance premium, which would be reimbursed by the Council as per the long term agreement.

## f. Highways

Parishes had to share the speed gun which was causing some problems.

## g. Bumblekyte

The manufacture of the seat was underway.

#### h. Bus Shelters

It was agreed that an open board be fastened to the rear of the interior of the Bus Shelter by the garage, for the display of community notices. A volunteer had come forward to keep tidy the shelter at *The Croft*.

#### i. SDW Facilities

Nothing new to report. The Clerk was still to contact the SDNPA about improved signage at this location.

### j. Footpaths

Several footpaths were becoming overgrown with seasonal growth. The Clerk would ascertain when the spring cut was due by WSCC. If it was not likely to be in the near future, RESOLVED that the Council would employ a contractor to undertake some work, within the allocated budget. (Chair and Clerk to liaise.)

#### k. Cycleways

MAC was holding a meeting shortly.

#### l. Broadband

Nothing new to report - remove from future agendas.

#### m. Village First Aid

Nothing new to report.

## n. Website

Nothing new to report.

#### o. NHB Allocation 2016-17

Cocking had been allocated £2,100 for 2016-17. RESOLVED that an application be submitted to put the funds towards the planned Village Hall extension.

### p. The Croft

The Clerk reported that Hyde Group was now unwilling to create additional parking around the edge of the green; however they were still planning to erect the rail, also the speed hump at the entrance to Cherry Close.

## q. Village Shop

The Clerk reported that following an enquiry, the Post Office confirmed that they had no plans to change the current Post Office provision in the village.

#### r. Press Coverage

Members were concerned that in the round-up of Parish Council news in the local newspaper, a story had been wrongly attributed to Cocking. The Clerk would contact the newspaper to ask that more care be taken.

#### s. **HWRC Consultation**

RESOLVED that no comment be made.

#### 10. Finance

- **a.** <u>Payments</u> between 12 May and 6 June 2016, as set out in Appendix B, were approved and any <u>receipts</u> noted.
- b. A <u>bank reconciliation</u>, as set out in Appendix C, showing a Cashbook and Bank balance agreeing of £15,090.88 as at 4 May 2016, was noted. In accordance with good practice, Cllr Imlach viewed Bank Statement No 26 and initialled the corresponding balance.
- c. An application for a <u>grant</u> from CAB was deferred pending further information on their work in the Cocking area.

d. Members considered the <u>Internal Audit Report 2015-16</u> and were pleased to note that no significant matters had been raised. Any matters raised would be considered at a future meeting.

The Clerk had submitted a summary of notable correspondence since the last meeting - attached Appendix D.
