## Your Parish Council

This year saw the end of a five-year term of office when all Councillors have to stand down and, if interested in continuing, seek re-election. Only three put their names down and a new person came forward, namely Tim Waite.

Well it is great to report that although we were three short we now have a full house of Councillors as Richard Marks came back and two new faces were co-opted, David Summerfield and Robert Jenkins.

This year under the leadership of Frances Russell the following items are under way:

- The installation of the GATEWAY at the Midhurst side of the village.
- The creation of a FACEBOOK page.
- The refurbishment of the Daffodil Bank that is located on the bank by the Croft bus shelter with over 1000 Daffodils being planted.



The installation of safety PVC at both bus shelters to eliminate the smaller glass panels being smashed or the small PVC ones being kicked out.

To liaise with various agencies in the creation of a safe walk and cycleway from the South Downs Way to finish up by the war memorial.

#### PLAYGROUND

In the last twelve months £800 has been spent on refurbishment which was mainly the swings and some of the wood treads on the climbing frame. Next year it is expected to be the same investment to replace the wooden slats on the large picnic table and part of the perimeter fencing. A new sign has also been fixed at the entrance detailing Conditions of Use, replacing many individual signs.



# CHANGES TO COCKING VILLAGE HALL COMMITTEE 2019
